

Please note the dates of the two concerts: **Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> March** in the Unitarian Church, and **Good Friday the 30<sup>th</sup> March** in Whitton Baptist Church. There will be extra rehearsals (optional but very useful!) on three Wednesdays through the term at Whitton. It'll be great singing with a double-sized choir!


Term starts on the 8<sup>th</sup> January, but **PLEASE** sign up **before** term starts or college will think there won't be enough people, and will want to close it down!
