

With soloists, guest singers almost doubling our numbers, and our fabulous accompanist Mike, we performed Elijah, in St. Anne's Church Kew on the 15th July in aid of SPEAR London. There was a good audience, who gave us the longest applause in our history! And, with the ticket money, refreshment donations and bucket collection, we raised about £1330 for SPEAR to help the homeless of the borough. Well done us!

A big thank you goes out to all our guest chorus – it was great to have you all and a real treat for us to have such good numbers. We also had many soloists supporting us and bringing the work to life: Alex, Lucy, Janet, Panos, Joey, and Richard. Lucy and Janet stepped in at the last minute to cover ill singers, so we are grateful to them for doing such a great job. I loved the quartets, trios and so on – showing Mendelssohn's delicacy as well as his barn-storming choral capabilities! Our lead soloists Jerome, John and Rosalind were amazing: it's a huge work with BIG arias and they were fabulous. Jerome was magnificent, and we very much hope he can sing with us again sometime!

A new step for us was having the words projected on a big screen – there are improvements to be made in this system but I hope you'll agree it worked well. We were all delighted with the beautiful, evocative backgrounds for the libretto, created by Lyn.

Other members of the RCS team did their usual fantastic, reliable jobs to ensure the smooth running of the term and of the event (before, during and afterwards).
